DESIGNER ALEXANDRA PONTING "This kitchen needed to be big, without feeling sterile! A homely space with a contemporary edge to suit our clients' extra-large extended family. It was important to respect the original 1930s timber-clad home, bringing it into the 21st century without feeling overtly modern. Favourite elements include the custom-made tiled structure to conceal the rangehood. The shape gives the space a strong point of interest, and allows the long tiled wall to feel uninterrupted. The Mouette architectural pendant lamp creates equal parts contrast and harmony. The diffused clear finish respects the kitchen palette, while the angular shape pushes the classic scheme into another dimension." *What luxury item did you choose for this space regardless of budget?* "[The] entire wall of tiles that extends into the adjoining dining room.
